

<u>Reflections/Personal Growth</u> – Diane Heilmann read Michael Shelton's newspaper article "Reflections on Domestic Violence".

<u>Members Updates and Announcements</u> – Dr. Stephanie Morton is attending her daughter's wedding. The following guests were introduced: Irene Diesel, Carol Parsons, Glenna Baumbaugh, Ann Harper Hanson and Nancy Glasgow from Gamma Eta Chapter; Molly Hunter, Judy Pflaumer, Maria Cholak, Holly Scroggins and Pat Eveslage as guests of members and Rickell Howard Smith and Nicole Williams from the Cincinnati YWCA.

<u>Approval of December minutes.</u> – The December 9, 2023, meeting minutes were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Margaret Murph, treasurer reported revenue \$3,975.22; expenses \$3,143.14. Checking account balance \$6,146.91. Scholarship/Grant account balance \$4556.98, disbursements from Scholarship/Grant account \$745.00.

Committee Reports

<u>Membership</u> – Dianne Donnelly recommended for membership by Carol Ladrigan; Judith Pflaumer recommended by Carolyn Lamping and Molly Hunter recommended by Meier Bauer.

<u>Rules</u> – Katie Gantz, Parliamentarian, announced Gamma Phi Chapter Rules were revised, following notification in The Gamma Phi Gazette, to remain in compliance with the DKG governing documents. The Chapter Rules now read:

- 3.1 New members shall be recommended at any regularly scheduled meeting of the fiscal year.
- 3.2 Membership in the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International shall be by invitation. At the time she pays her dues, a member becomes a member of the International Society, a state organization and a chapter.

<u>Professional Affairs</u> – Karyn Kern-Lazear, Professional Affairs Vice President, stated Diana Haskell, Sherry Randall and Kelsey Randall Sagasser applied and received Gamma Phi Scholarships for professional and personal growth. Julie Schmidt, Scholarship Chairman, distributed the award checks.

The Scholarship Committee will review the non-member guidelines application.

<u>Finance Committee</u> – Jane Houser, Finance Committee Chairman, distributed the 2024- 2025 proposed chapter budget. She noted: President/Conventions increase to \$400; President Elect/Conventions increase to \$350; Nominating Committee decrease to \$0; Installation of Officers decrease to \$0; President Pin/Gift decrease to \$0; Miscellaneous increase to \$400 and New Officer Training decrease to \$0.

March Meeting Minutes continued

It was moved to establish a Board Designated *You Belong Here!* Fund for Gamma Phi members to receive financial support to attend DKG International and State Conventions, Conferences, Workshops, Meetings and Events. Funding revenue to come from The Piggest Raffle Ever! and other non-dues revenue sources. The fund to be managed and awards made by the Gamma Phi Executive Board. **The motion was adopted.**

The Finance Committee will present a revised 2024-2025 budget. The budget vote occurs at the June 8, 2024 meeting.

<u>Programs Update</u> – Diana Haskell, Program Chairman, acknowledged committee members for their dedication to programing and philanthropic opportunities provided to the membership. Members are encouraged to volunteer at Brand Evolution in April and register to participate at the Duke Center on May 2. Dollars earned for our volunteer time are donated to the chapter scholarship fund.

The Piggest Raffle Ever! continues through May 4. To date members and supporters have purchased \$220 in raffle tickets. The raffle ticket amount will be returned to the chapter by the Flying Pig Organization.

Encouraged members to register to attend the Ohio State Organization meeting and workshop on Approaching Conflict with Grace on April 6, 2024, in Grove City, OH. Registration closes March 20, 2024.
