Buckeye Cherry 2019-2020 Membership Challenge


Our state organization is challenging all Ohio DKG chapters to make use of the 3 R's of membership -

I had always dreamed of being a teacher since I was in first grade. However, when I took the high school aptitude test the results stated that I should go into business.
