It is hard to believe that I have spent all but four years of my life in southwest Ohio. I was born in Middletown



and spent all of my school years in the Middletown City Schools. I attended Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia where I studied Speech Pathology. I went to Speech Therapy during my elementary years and that experience is what lead me to this field. At that time in West Virginia (the early 70's), there were very few school therapists so for my student teaching assignment (three half days a week), I had no supervising teacher. I was given a building, told to screen referred students, set-up a schedule, and provide services. My university supervisor visited twice during the semester. I will say, however, that it did prepare me for my first job for Clermont Northeastern School District where I was the only SLP. Marshall is also where I met Joe, my husband, and created many memories that are still fresh in my mind including the airplane crash that killed the Marshall's football team and supporters in November, 1970.

Joe and I settled in Cincinnati since we both found employment before our wedding in August, 1972. We started our careers in the school setting (Joe was a special education teacher), and never had a desire to change professions. During the next years, we both earned Master's degrees from Miami University, had two sons (Noah and Evan), as well as two grandchildren (Eli and Claire). Those years went by quickly and after 35 years, Joe retired from Princeton City Schools and I retired from the Hamilton County Educational Service Center. I then worked for Finneytown Local School District for five more years. Younger teachers could not believe that we had worked that long; what can I say – we LOVED our jobs.

Outside of my professional life, I have been and still am active in other organizations. I was President of a PTA, President of
