September 2018 Feature Member Judy Rosene

Fifty-two years ago, I was invited, along with fifteen other key educators, to become a charter member of Gamma Phi Chapter of DKG. I felt that it was an honor to be selected as a young Mt. Healthy fourth grade teacher. Soon after our initiation on May 21st, 1966, I left from Greater Cincinnati Airport to chaperone a group of eleven of my students to fly to Altenwerder, Germany, where each one would spend two weeks living in the home of his or her pen pal. I was able to initiate and carry out this adventure with the support of the parents of my students, parents of the German kids and their English teacher. Amazingly, after nearly fifty years, I was able to locate most of these pen pals and to have a 50 year reunion with them to remember our awesome time together in Germany. Now we are in the process of finding the German pen pals to reunite them with their American friends.

From the time I was a child, I had always had an interest in international people and had pen pals myself in several parts of the world. I always managed to find pan pals for my fourth grade pupils, which gave them a firsthand knowledge of the countries which we studied in social studies.

When I got married to Richard Rosene, and we had two daughters, Bonnie and Maia, we hosted international graduate students from U.C. for many years through the International Visitors Center. During the time when I was a "stay at home mom," I became the Area Representative for the Pacific Educational and Cultural Exchange and matched up host families with high school exchange students from many countries. Each of our daughters had opportunities to travel overseas and spend time living with international families.

When I returned to the classroom, I became an English as a Second Language teacher in the Sycamore Community Schools. My students, from kindergarten to sixth grade, came from as many as 20 different countries. Most of their parents were professional people. I absolutely loved helping them feel comfortable in their new school as they learned their new language, and I would sometimes visit in their homes to help answer the parents' questions about school. We started the Sycamore International Moms Group to help support the mothers of these little children. I went back to school at that time to earn my Master's Degree in TESOL by commuting on weekends to the University of Findlay.

During my last five years of teaching ESL I taught immigrant children in Princeton. It was an entirely different job as I became a "social worker" to try to help the poor families in every way that they needed assistance, from providing clothing to delivering donated furniture. I loved this new challenge in my teaching career as I was able to help the kids in so many different ways.



My husband and I have now been married 56 years and continue to enjoy helping people as well as traveling to places we have always dreamed about. Often we visit in other countries with international friends or former students and their families whom we met in Cincinnati. In June of this year, we took our entire family, which included our older daughter, Bonnie, and her husband, Dug Mara and our two grandchildren, Dugan, 17, and Sage, 15, as well as our other daughter, Maia Rosene, and her friend, Michael Doleman, on a National Geographic Expedition in Alaska. What an awesome experience that was as a family!
