# Gamma Phi's Standing Rules – Where do they stand?

At the February meeting the changes that were made to the revised Standing Rules (after the January meeting) were discussed. It was decided that the Standing Rules Committee would make a motion at the March meeting and then the membership would vote.

Well...... We know what has happened since that time. The Standing Rules Committee intends to make a motion at the September meeting to approve the revised Standing Rules, as written, and ask for a vote after a period of discussion.

Major changes were not made to the Rules, but we needed to align them with OSO's Bylaws. Some of the changes were permitting nominations for new members to occur at any scheduled meeting and voted upon that day, new members become active members upon the payment of dues, dues for the following year will be announced at the last meeting of the fiscal year and must be paid by June 30th, and the budget must be presented at the first meeting of the fiscal year. Other changes did not change the content or meaning of the rule but updated the language.

A copy of the revised Standing Rules will be sent out after Labor Day so you will have a chance to review the entire document before September 12th. If you have any questions, please contact any of the committee members listed below.
