#### What is the Gold Key?

Louisa Strock, Beta Zeta started the Gold Key, in 1982 with the first awards given out in 1983. She designed the Gold Key as an incentive program intended to make chapters aware of the activities required by the Society and at the same time to recognize outstanding chapters and their leaders. The program helps each chapter realize higher achievements as its members cooperate to achieve the expected goals. Timely response from chapters helps State officers and committee chairman meet their reporting deadlines and recognize chapter success.

#### **Professional Affairs Update**

Each month this committee will provide information that relates to the "educators" aspect of the organization. Last month Mary Jo Berry supplied a list of recent bills being discussed and/or passed in Columbus & we will continue to keep all members aware this important information.

Applications for Grants-in-Aid are submitted from high school (typically) students to this committee when requesting stipends to support some of their college fees. This award has a long history in Gamma Phi of helping students and we want it to continue.

Scholarships are available to Gamma Phi <u>members</u> for professional development (college classes, workshops, and conventions), to support classroom projects that need financial help, as well as monies to attend Life Long Learning activities that have topics of interest to them. Funds for these expenditures are earned through different fund raising events.

Our primary source of revenue is the Flying Pig Marathon. Prior to race day many members have volunteered to roll posters, fold clothes, or count safety pins to name a few. The Flying Pig organization then rewards Gamma Phi, along with other organizations, with money to use in their group. Sue Eades has served as our Flying Pig coordinator since we began participating and she has agreed to do so again in 2023.

The Professional Affairs Committee hopes that Gamma Phi members and student family members will take advantage of these resources.
